Mountain Cathedrals November 18

The November Mountain Cathedrals Hike will be held Saturday, November 18. Going a bit further afield this time, we journey to the Rio Puerco area south of Cabezon peak. The Hoodoo Trail in the Ojito Wilderness awaits. This walk is of moderate difficulty (4 miles, a few hundred feet of elevation change), and is a good introduction to the fabulous desert scenery in this part of NM. The area is interesting for its geology (numerous volcanic necks, sandstone formations and convoluted structures), botany (Ponderosas below 6000 feet elevation), human history (the Navajos and Apaches did not always get along), and what we may find in ourselves on this journey. Plan to be at St. John's (east lot) by 7:30 a.m. Prepare for cold weather and sun and bring lunch; return by 2:00 p.m.

Please join us for this hike of meditation, wilderness, and time apart from our normal schedules.


The following is the schedule of events and locations throughout the church building.

Family Spirit Class New Series

Please join us at St. John's UMC on Sunday mornings at 9:30 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. in room 257 as we study a new book and DVD, *Adult Bible Studies*. Each week we will watch a short 5 minute video in class with comments from the author and then discuss questions. In November 2023, we will study Unit 1 - Food. And folks are welcome to drop by any week to sample the class and try it out. Free admission and open to all adults.

Preview for Unit 1:

Scripture recognizes that hunger, famine, and food insecurity make people vulnerable to a variety of threats. It also testifies to God's generous provision of food for humans and wild creatures and to human responsibility to help those who are hungry and in need. From God's provision of manna in the wilderness to divine provision during famine, from Jesus' feeding of crowds to his teaching of a new way of being with the poor and marginalized through table fellowship, Scripture bears witness to God's graciousness and our responsibility as its recipients. Bible lessons in this unit are based on Exodus 16, 1 Kings 19, Mark 6, and Luke 14. Spiritual Practice: Feasting
