Coalition in Response to the Lives Lost From Street Racing

On October 8, 2023, Jenna Hamilton, was killed as the result of a horrific street-racing crash on Louisiana NE. The driver of one of the speeding cars died as well. In response to this tragic accident, members of St. Andrew Presbyterian Church are seeking to form a coalition to address the increasingly dangerous practice of speeding and drag racing on

our city streets in Albuquerque.

Initially, they plan to contact Tammy Feibelkorn, the city councilor in whose district the accident occurred. With her input, they hope to first create a committee broadening into a coalition with the intent of requesting renewed interest in and funding to combat this public health issue.

Snack Items

During the month of December, we will be collecting "snack items" for Tierra Adentro New Mexico (TANM) Arts Charter School, located in NW Albuquerque, and serving mid- and high-school students. The function of TANM is to ensure quality education in the arts and academics for children, while facilitating a deep understanding and practical application of New Mexico's cultural roots and traditions.

We currently provide weekend meal bags each week for five of their students who are homeless/food insecure and will continue to do so. However, they have identified an additional 50 students who are food insecure and we would like to help out any way we can. This month we are collecting snack items which will be distributed by the counselor as needed at TANM. Suggested **SINGLE-SERVE** items are: cheese and crackers, beef jerky, applesauce, pudding, fruit cups, granola bars, power bars, cereal bars, ravioli, spaghettios, macaroni and cheese, soups (pull tab openings), ramen noodles, trail mix, fruit snacks, boxed drinks and juices, chips, pretzels, Goldfish, Vienna sausages, pop tarts, or oatmeal.
