In preparation for our next sermon series, I have been thinking about spirituality and how different people experience it. Why do some people feel closest to God when they are meditating in a monastery while others experience God most profoundly in a Bible study or by going to seminary? Why are some people drawn to God's close presence when they are marching for justice or feeding the poor while others find their spirituality in singing hymns together with others or greeting friends at church with a hug?

Over the next several weeks, we'll be talking about and exploring your "spiritual type." I'll save the full explanation for Sunday mornings, but the idea is that God created all of us with a unique blend of spiritual strengths. Some are better at experiencing God through intellect and thought while others find God through feelings and emotion. Some want to know God with the closeness and certainty of a close friend while others embrace God's mystery and bigness. When Jesus commanded that we love the Lord our God with all our heart, mind, soul, and strength, turns out we are created as "heart people" or "strength people."

We'll be exploring the spiritual types in worship this fall. Each of you has one and I hope this exploration will help you better understand yourself and where you fit in the cattywampus patchwork quilt that is God's church. Join us Sunday mornings to learn more about your type.
